These discoveries encourages LNG plants on Somalia, Tanzania and Mozambique and will make the zone akin to the Northwest Shelf in Australia and Qatar but situated on the western edge of the Asian LNG import market and in competition with older supply centers in Southeast Asia and Australasia.
